Greetings in the Precious name of Jesus Christ!

I am a member of the Northern Cheyenne Tribe in Lame Deer, MT and we are in desperate need of humanitarian aid to the Northern Cheyenne Reservation in Lame Deer, MT dealing with the deadly corona virus!!

The Northern Cheyenne Indian Reservation is home of the federally recognized Northern Cheyenne tribe. Located in southeastern Montana, the reservation is approximately 690 square miles in size and home to approximately 5,000 Cheyenne people. Lame Deer, MT is the Capitol of the Northern Cheyenne Nation. Website: cheyennenation.com

On August 23, 2020 there was an EXECUTIVE ORDER declared by the President of the Northern Cheyenne tribe of EXTREME STATE OF EMERGENCY due to the rapid community spread of the Corona Virus.

Since this has been in place, there has been a total of 23 deaths and counting daily with 60% of those dying of the COVID-19 Virus and 20 plus people being hospitalized. As of today there is about 10% of the people who have tested positive of the virus.

The hospitals are 100+ miles from the reservation which is an extreme hardship on the families. There is NO adequate facilities for a quarantine area and to be manned. Many of the health professionals and tribal employees are testing positive for the corona virus, which in turn limits the hands that are needed to assist the sick and normal operations of the said facilities.

There are many reasons of the spread. There is a widespread of poverty, poor health care, diabetes, cancer, drug and alcohol addictions are high among the people, homelessness, multiple families in a single dwelling, many homes have no water, sewer issues and crimes being committed with only 1-2 police officers able to respond to a large area and no jail facility on the reservation. Some of these crimes are rape and murder. Montana is also one of the highest rates of suicide in the the nation.

This deadly virus is taking the lives of many of our elders who carry our language and knowledge of the Cheyenne people. Our people are hurting with a death occurring everyday with many being closely related. The people are hopeless, devastated, in a constant time of mourning, grieving, traumatized, angry and hostile, Basically an atmosphere of lateral oppression that is raging out of control.

If there is anyway your organization can help out with this epidemic would be greatly appreciated.
