We are coming to the end of a busy spring and summer! Groups from MT, VA, AL, and MO have helped us immensely this year!

Due to recent unemployment spikes among the Crow People, we are now focusing on a great humanitarian need: working with the Pryor Food Bank on the Crow Reservation.

Four Winds spent \$950 (thanks to our donors and supporters!) for food, diapers, etc. for the Pryor Food Bank. We were told that our most recent load helped 37 families (185 people, of which 85 were children!). We left more needs unmet than we were able to fill. This will now be a monthly ministry endeavor!
