From The Director's Desk

During the flood last year, we all knew God was speaking to us. At that time, we were waiting and listening. NOW WE KNOW!. After having the ministry center for 11 years, hosting various events: Youth Camps, Chaplain and Ministry Training, etc., we finally believe Four Winds has fully stepped into its Divine Purpose!

We have all believed Four Winds Ministry Center had a much greater mission than holding summer camps, training sessions and hosting work groups. It IS a place of safety, rescue and healing (Isaiah 45:1). First, the Foster Home in Lame Deer became a reality for this ministry through Justin answering the call. Now, doors of opportunity are presenting us with Native American children needing a place of safety and healing away from the reservation. How do we know this is what God is speaking? Because after years of us going to them – they are now coming to us! We have not gone seeking these children; we are getting calls and requests to take them! Kim has recently accepted two Native American sisters here at Four Winds! Their mother asked us for a place of safety – a sanctuary for her loved ones to come to. Tim (our oldest son), his wife Tobie, and their three girls now have an open door to take an infant – and in a few short months another native baby – newborns whom they feel God has asked them to take in, protect, and provide for. This is in addition to the eight children Justin houses in the Foster Home in Lame Deer. NOW is when we need your help as never before. Finances are one thing there never seems to be enough of – from running the Foster Home in Lame Deer, to ministering to overwhelming needs that exist on the reservations, to our ministry opportunity to provide a place of refuge and hope to these little ones. We WILL NOT and CANNOT turn them away.
