From The Director's Desk

We are so thankful to God for His goodness and faithfulness.

The first week in December we were able to deliver almost \$3,000.00 worth of new clothes and blankets for children on the Northern Cheyenne Reservation.

Our trailer was loaded with 105 new winter coats, 50 pairs of winter pajamas, 300 wool blankets, plus 48 sets of hand knitted hats and scarves. These all went to the Boys and Girls Club at Lame Deer.

We also delivered 25 pairs of infant/toddler pajamas and 25 blankets to the Dull Knife Day Care at Lame Deer. The day care is run by Shannlyn Spotted Elk's mother. (Some of you may remember Shannlyn from previous newsletters.)

These items arrived just days before a season of bitter cold and snow. Over 20 inches of snow with winds creating 10 foot drifts. Temperatures dropping to 38 below with 60 below zero windchills. This delivery could not have happened without the faithful help of our supporters.
